What is the role?

Chosen Codebreakers must be available for a short online briefing on 10 January 2023, and a daytime workshop on 16 January 2023 at Bletchley Library to share ideas and thoughts, supported by a team of artists. There are no special skills or artistic knowledge required, this is about your local connection and stories.

Those selected will be paid the National Living Wage for their time, and will receive a free annual pass for Bletchley Park.
